E. Stanley Jones once wrote, “At the cross God wrapped his heart in flesh and blood and let it be nailed to the cross for our redemption.”

That human heart stopped beating as a part of the process to save us. But the body rose again to show the love of God with an even more powerful spiritual rhythm.

Our human pulse represents a periodic push of blood through our body; on a higher level, this communion is like a weekly [infusion or] push of the blood of Christ in us and in His body, the church.

Think of the wave of power as we all think together of the great sacrifice of love that this communion represents!
